





#### Projektraum Drahnsdorf, 60km from Berlin

- natural and inspiring place as it was laid out as a park (7.000 sqm)
- based on the concept of creative action, the association understands that all creative activity takes place out of a field having inspiring effects on actions.
- The simultaneity of the past, the present and what is to come makes the place special: much of the old days has been preserved.

### **Sustainable Futures Camp - Overview**

- o mixed groups of 4 students (**CREATIVE TEAMS**) will ideate and accelerate their new media format concepts to spread knowledge about positive futures supporting the convivial conversation and needed socio-ecological transformation reflecting critically on media and technologies
- o mixed groups of 8 students and teachers (**WORKING TEAMS**) will support the camp organisation, e.g. breakfast or lunch preps etc.
